# QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS & INVITATIONAL COMPETITIONS

\*NOTE THAT FOR QUALIFYING  
COMPETITIONS THE SCHEDULE MUST  
BE SENT TO THE EVENTS MANAGER NO  
LATER THAN 6 WEEKS BEFORE THE  
EVENT FOR APPROVAL.

- COMPETITION FORMAT AND WARM UP OPTION
  - REFER TO TECH REGS FOR WARM UP AND ROUTINE TIMES
- NUMBER OF TOTAL ATHLETES (NO MORE THAN 40 PER SESSION)
- GUIDELINE:
  - 200 LEVEL 1-3, 160 LEVEL 4-6, 130 LEVEL 7-10 PER PANEL, PER DAY
  - CANNOT SCHEDULE PAST 7:30PM (11 HOURS MAX)
- DESIGNATION OF DAYS
- JUDGES AVAILABLE (SPECIFIC LEVELS OF JUDGES)
- REGISTRATION TIME
- MARCH IN TIME
- WARM UP TIME
- COMPETITION TIME
- AWARDS TIME
- BREAKS FOR JUDGES

# YOUR SCHEDULE

WHAT DO YOU WANT YOUR WEEKEND TO LOOK LIKE?

- HOW MANY ATHLETES ARE YOU ABLE TO FIT INTO THE WEEKEND (2 DAYS OR 3 DAYS)?
- HOW LONG DO YOU WANT YOUR DAYS TO BE?
- HOW MANY SESSIONS PER DAY?
- DO NOT COMBINE LEVEL 1-3 ATHLETES WITH LEVEL 4+ ATHLETES IN THE SAME SESSION
- DO NOT COMBINE XCEL ATHLETES WITH JO ATHLETES IN THE SAME SESSION
- GROUP THE SESSIONS BY COMPETITIVE LEVEL AND THEN BY AGE (BETTER TO HAVE YOUNG ATHLETES TOGETHER AT THE START OF THE DAY AND OLDER TOGETHER LATER)
- WHEN YOU KNOW HOW MANY ATHLETES PER SESSION YOU NEED TO DETERMINE HOW MANY ATHLETES IN A ROTATION
  - 37-40 ATHLETES = 10 PER ROTATION
  - 33-36 = 9 ATHLETES PER ROTATION
  - 29-32 = 8 ATHLETES PER ROTATION
  - 25-28 = 7 ATHLETES PER ROTATION
  - 21-24 = 6 ATHLETES PER ROTATION

# OCP FORMAT (STANDARD)

- ATHLETES CONTINUE TO ROTATE TO EVENT AS SOON AS THE ROTATION IS COMPLETE (AS DIRECTED BY THE CCJ)
- 1 PANEL OF JUDGES
- COMPETITION TIME IS DETERMINED BY THE WARM-UP TIME OF THE LONGEST EVENT FOR THE HIGHEST LEVEL OF ATHLETES
  - ALSO DETERMINED BY THE LARGEST ROTATION
- IDEAL MAX NUMBER IN THE SESSION IS 32 (8 PER EVENT) SO THAT WARM-UPS DO NOT HAVE TO BE SPLIT
  - IF THERE ARE 33 ATHLETES IN THE SESSION, YOU MUST USE THE AMOUNT OF 9 ATHLETES IN A ROTATION TO CALCULATE THE COMPETITION TIME.
- FORMAT: PLEASE SEE SUMMARY CHART ON THE WEBSITE FOR BREAKDOWN OF TIME NEEDED PER ATHLETE FOR EACH LEVEL
  - # OF ATHLETES IN LARGEST ROTATION X # OF MINUTES NEEDED PER ATHLETE = TIME PER ROTATION.
  - MULTIPLY THIS NUMBER BY 4 ROTATIONS TO GET THE TOTAL COMPETITION TIME
  - DIVIDE THAT NUMBER BY 60 (MINUTES) TO DETERMINE HOW MANY HOURS THE COMPETITION TIME
- SUMMARY CHART ALSO HAS CHEAT SHEET FOR DETERMINING COMPETITION TIME PER LEVEL
- NEW FOR 2019-2020 – XCEL – BE SURE TO ROUND UP YOUR TIMING

- TO BE DONE BY THE SPECIFIC PROGRAM MANAGER AND EVENTS MANAGER
- RANDOM DRAW IS CONDUCTED THROUGH BEYOND THE SCORES



# QUALIFYING & INVITATIONAL COMPETITIONS

- HOST CLUBS' RESPONSIBILITY
- CAN BE COMPLETELY RANDOM
- PLEASE SEE THE TECHNICAL RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS WHEN CONDUCTING THE ATHLETE DRAW
- NEED TO BE AWARE THAT IN BTS THE CLUBS TO START ON EACH EVENT ARE RANDOM, BUT ARE OFTEN IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER IN THE RANDOM START ORDER WITHIN THE ROTATION. THEREFORE YOU SHOULD USE THE 'RANDOM' BUTTON TO ADJUST. AFTER DOING SO, BE SURE THE ATHLETES FROM EACH CLUB ARE STILL LISTED TOGETHER
- ALWAYS TRY TO HAVE ONLY ONE LEVEL IN THE ROTATION (PREFERRED ONE LEVEL THROUGHOUT THE SESSION)
- IF THERE IS MORE THAN ONE LEVEL IN A SESSION, CREATE ROTATIONS BY THE LEVEL, NOT BY THE CLUB
  - CLUBS WILL OFTEN ENCOURAGE YOU TO KEEP THEIR ATHLETES TOGETHER – THIS IS NOT A REQUIREMENT. LEVEL TAKES PRIORITY OVER CLUB.

# SECURING JUDGES

- GO MEETS (CHAMPIONSHIPS - 3 JUDGES PER EVENT)
  - ALL JUDGES AND CCJ ARE ASSIGNED BY GO
- INVITATIONAL COMPETITIONS (2 JUDGES PER EVENT)
  - HOST IS RESPONSIBLE FOR SECURING CCJ AND ALL JUDGES
  - BEST TO SECURE EARLY AND CONFIRM
  - BE AWARE OF JUDGING REQUIREMENTS FOR COMPETITIVE LEVELS

# SECURING JUDGES

- QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS (2 JUDGES PER EVENT)
  - CCJ IS ASSIGNED BY GO
  - CCJ AND/OR HOST IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ATTAINING JUDGES FOR THE MEET
  - CCJ IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL CORRESPONDENCE WITH JUDGES ASSIGNED TO THE COMPETITION
  - CCJ IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ENSURING JUDGES ARE THE APPROPRIATE LEVEL FOR THE COMPETITION
  - CCJ IS RESPONSIBLE FOR CREATING PANELS
  - CCJ IS PAID AN ADDITIONAL \$100 PER DAY (TO BE ADDED TO THEIR HONORARIUM)
- IF YOU DESIGNATED SPECIFIC LEVELS TO BE SCHEDULED ON SPECIFIC DAYS IN YOUR BID TO HOST APPLICATION, THE FOLLOWING WILL OCCUR:
  - DAYS DESIGNATED AS LEVEL 1-5 ONLY WILL HAVE ONE LEVEL 9 (OR HIGHER) JUDGE AND ONE LEVEL 1-5 JUDGE (OR HIGHER) ASSIGNED ON EACH EVENT.
  - DAYS DESIGNATED AS XCEL WILL HAVE ONE LEVEL 9 (OR HIGHER) AND ONE XCEL JUDGE (OR HIGHER) ASSIGNED ON EACH EVENT
  - DAYS DESIGNATED AS LEVEL 6-10 WILL HAVE TWO LEVEL 9 (OR HIGHER) JUDGES ASSIGNED ON EACH EVENT.
  - IF NO DESIGNATION WAS PROVIDED, TWO LEVEL 9 (OR HIGHER) JUDGES WILL BE ASSIGNED ON EACH EVENT.
  - IF THERE IS A DAY WITHIN YOUR EVENT THAT HAS ONLY INVITATIONAL CATEGORIES (I.E XCEL, L 1 AND L2) THE HOST WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ACQUIRING JUDGES FOR THAT EVENT.

# JUDGES CONTINUED

- **ASSIGNMENTS FOR COMPETITIONS:**
- **COMPULSORY LEVEL 1-5:**  
MUST HAVE ONE LEVEL 9 JUDGE OR HIGHER, SECOND JUDGE MUST BE JO L5 OR HIGHER.
- **XCEL- BRONZE SILVER, GOLD:**  
ONE JOL9 JUDGE OR HIGHER, SECOND JUDGE MUST BE XCEL OR HIGHER.
- **OPTIONAL L 6-10:**  
TWO JOL9 JUDGES OR HIGHER (FOR LEVEL 10 PORTION MIN OF ONE JOL10 OR HIGHER)
- **NATIONAL LEVELS:**  
TWO JUDGES HP OR BREVET (CAN USE JO10N IF NEEDED)
