The Gymnastics Ontario Strategic Plan sets out the strategic priorities that will guide direction over the current four year Olympic cycle. Through the process of developing the Strategic Plan, 4 priority directions and 13 strategic objective were identified and are outlined below. A more detailed description is available in the 2013-2017 Strategic Plan report. The Strategic Plan does not focus on the many ongoing activities underway at Gymnastics Ontario and this does not diminish the importance of these activities, as they all contribute to achieving Gymnastics Ontario objectives.

- Coaching Depth and Excellence: Establishing a coordinated and effective system for attracting, training, developing and retaining coaches is fundamental to the future success and continuity of the club system of gymnastics in Ontario, and the development of our future champion gymnasts.
  - Depth Develop a strategy to increase the number of Level 2 and Level 3 coaches
  - B) Excellence - Partner with GCG to develop and improve the coaching curriculum (NCCP)
  - Excellence Develop a repository of resources to support coaching competency
- Public Awareness and Engagement: Ontario is home to 12 million people, and 2.3 million families with children. Despite being recognized as a foundation sport, and the ideal sport to introduce physical literacy to children, gymnastics is no longer part of the school physical education curriculum. We believe it incumbent on Gymnastics Ontario to introduce the benefits of our sport to Ontario's parents and their children.
  - Look to acquire amateur sport marketing and promotion expertise
  - Market the sport in partnership with GCG and Toronto 2015 in run-up to the Pan Am Games
  - Market the sport in partnership with clubs, community and schools
- Operational Standards and Compliance: Excellence starts with a commitment to quality, followed by establishing and effectively communicating our standards to all members of the Gymnastics Ontario community.
  - Standards—Review and streamline all policies and technical regulations
  - Assurance—Improve club compliance to standards and policies
- Athlete Retention: Participation in gymnastics drops off significantly during the teenage years, yet our sport relies on this group of gymnasts for its future coaches, judges and supporters. We believe participation in gymnastics should be life-long and opportunities for continued participation need to be identified and communicated to athletes.
  - Retention Develop competition and performance opportunities for non-national stream athletes
  - Retention Acknowledge and recognize the gymnast
  - Explore charter schools and/or a provincial training centre



# **President's Message**
























### **CANGYM Program**

The CANGYM Program binder is bilingual and comes complete with 5 distinct badge description sections outlining the skills in each level, and also includes original Participant Evaluation Forms and Progress Reports, along with Certificates of Participation and Completion that can be given to the participants. In addition, the CANGYM program includes a selection of Sample Coach's comments and Routines which coaches can utilize near the end of the term. This program can be adapted to a wide variety of age groups and abilities, and, paired with an enthusiastic coaching staff will help your club develop skilled and confident gymnasts.

The second edition of the CANGYM – ARTISTIC is endorsed by Olympic Champion Kyle Shewfelt.

Based on the CANGYM badge sales Gymnastics Ontario can determine that the majority of Ontario based gymnastics clubs are utilizing and have adopted this program. Currently the CANGYM badge program is being reviewed to include Rhythmic Gymnastics as has been done with Trampoline sports who currently utilize the CANJUMP program.

### **HIGH FIVE PROGRAM**

Gymnastics Ontario also supports, delivers and encourages accrediting clubs as HIGH FIVE. HIGH FIVE is a comprehensive quality assurance standard for children`s sport and recreation programs for children aged 6 to 12.

### I LOVE GYMNASTICS WEEK

Gymnastics Ontario supports and promotes *I Love Gymnastics Week* which is now a National initiative that sees clubs across the country participating in demonstrations from inside their clubs to malls and in some cases taking gymnastics to the streets. The event has received proclamation by Mayors across Ontario yearly and supports the promotion of a fun environment for gymnasts of all ages to demonstrate their ability and commitment to programs. Some of the group demonstrations from *I Love Gymnastics Week* will move on to Canadian *Gymnaestrada* and in some cases to the World *Gymnaestrada*. Ontario's Rhythmic gymnastics clubs are the largest promoters of these events given their pre alignment to group routines.

The scope of adoption for these programs and events vary. The masters and invitational competitions see over 67% of our member clubs participating which is a great number committed to the development of lifelong gymnastics skills.


# **Coach Development**




Gymnastics Ontario has successfully arranged organized and co-hosted one hundred and forty NCCP courses during the 2012/2013 season. We would like to thank all G.O. Clubs and Learning Facilitators who have helped to make all courses a tremendous success. We appreciate you support and dedication. Host Clubs received over \$32,000.00 from Gymnastics Ontario in rental and complimentary registration fees. Financial incentives continue to allow clubs to use NCCP courses as a fundraising opportunity.


Gymnastics Ontario continues to work with the outlying areas of Ontario to organize NCCP courses, we appreciate and understand the challenges of these areas and are constantly trying to come up with unique and cost effective ways to offer as many courses as are required. We have hosted over 10 courses in the Northern Region and trained over 40 coaches in Foundations Artistic and Trampoline disciplines and 6 coaches in Level 2 Women's Technical course.

NCCP courses this past year consisted of the three main disciplines - Artistic, Trampoline and Rhythmic, training over 700 coaches in Foundations and over 300 coaches in Level 2 Technical courses.



## **Coach Education**





On-line Risk Management Program continues to be mandatory for all Gymnastics Ontario coaches. In 2012-2013 we have had 448 coaches complete Part A and 311 coaches Part B modules.

We continue working on new ways in order to provide Clubs and Coaches with the information, resources and courses needed so that coaches can strive to be the best that they can. Keep an eye out for exciting new initiatives in the upcoming season!

### **Independent Auditor's Report**

### 1 Incorporation and operations

The Ontario Gymnastic Federation (the Federation) was incorporated as a not-for-profit organization without share capital under the Corporations Act of Ontario by letters patent dated April 3, 1974.

The Federation leads the sport of gymnastics in Ontario by striving for excellence in the development and promotion of quality programs and services that encourage lifelong involvement for all participants.

### 2 Summary of significant accounting policies

Effective July 1, 2012, the Federation elected to adopt Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations - Part III of The Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants Handbook (ASNPO) as issued by the Canadian Accounting Standards Board. Subject to certain transition exemptions and in accordance with Section 1501, First-time Adoption by Not-For-Profit Organizations, the accounting policies under this framework have been applied consistently and retrospectively as if these policies had always been in effect. There were no adjustments to the balance sheets and the statements of income and expense, changes in net assets and cash flows as a result of transitioning to ASNPO.

Outlined below are those specific policies considered particularly significant in the preparation of these financial statements.

### Revenue recognition

The Federation follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions, which includes government grants. Operating grants are recorded as income in the period to which they relate. Contributions received for equipment and development costs are initially deferred and then amortized into income on the same basis as the associated asset.

Membership fees and user fees are recorded as income in the period to which they relate. Amounts received in advance of the related membership year are deferred at year-end.

Sponsor grants related to specific events are deferred until the year in which the event is held, at which time they are recorded as income as the amounts are expended on applicable programs. Other grants are included in income when received or receivable.

The Federation also receives grants from the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport. The approved grant for the funding period from April 2013 to March 2014 is \$215,346 (April 2012 to March 2013 - \$226,680).

### Contributed materials and services

A substantial number of volunteers contribute a significant amount of time each year. Due to the difficulty of determining their fair value, these contributed services are not recognized or disclosed in the financial statements and related financial statement notes. Contributed materials are recorded when received at their fair value unless fair value cannot be reasonably determined.

### Cash and short-term deposits

Cash and short-term deposits represent cash in the bank and short-term guaranteed investment certificates.

### **Inventory**

Inventory is stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is determined on a first-in, first-out basis. Net realizable value is the selling cost of the product less provision for normal selling costs.

### Property and equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Amortization on equipment and leasehold improvements is provided on a straight-line basis over five years, as this is the estimated useful life.

The Federation reviews the carrying amount of property and equipment for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying amount may not be recoverable. Any impairment determined by a comparison of the estimated undiscounted future operating cash flows to be generated by the asset with its net carrying value is written off at the time of impairment.

### **Development costs**

Development costs represent costs incurred to develop the website and the online registration system for use by the member clubs. Development costs are amortized on a straight-line basis over five years.

### Income tax status

The Federation is a not-for-profit organization as defined under the Income Tax Act and, therefore, no income taxes are provided for in these financial statements.

### Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with ASNPO requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of income and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ significantly from those estimates.

### Financial instruments

The Federation's financial instruments recognized in the balance sheet consist of cash and short-term deposits, accounts receivable and accounts payable and accrued liabilities. The fair values of these instruments approximate their carrying amounts due to their short-term maturities. It is management's opinion that the Foundation is not exposed to any significant risks arising from these financial instruments.

### 8 Commitments

The Federation has entered into a long-term lease agreement for its office space, which includes automatic yearly renewals and expires on October 31, 2024. The Federation can cancel this lease agreement at any time by giving 90 day's written notice. An amount of \$50,436 is committed under this lease agreement for the next fiscal year. The annual lease commitment will escalate annually in accordance with the terms of the lease agreement.

### 9 Related party transactions

During the year, the Federation entered into various transactions with member clubs, which are owned by a member of the senior management team or various members of the Board of Directors. Revenues earned from these member clubs amounted to \$152,758 (2012 - \$134,051) and expenses incurred amounted to \$2,511 (2012 - \$7,090).

As at June 30, 2013, these member clubs had prepaid membership fees relating to the 2013/2014 membership year in the amount of \$4,502 (2012 - \$896) and the Federation owed these clubs a total of \$1,871 (2012 - \$nil).

These transactions were in the normal course of operations and are measured at the exchange amount, which is the amount of consideration established and agreed to by the related parties. The member clubs are charged fees consistent with arm's length clubs.

### 10 Special assessment

In October 2010, the members approved a \$2 special assessment fee to be levied on each participant for the fiscal years ending 2012 and 2013. In October 2012, this period was extended to include the fiscal year ending 2014. The special assessment fee is required to be split equally to fund the operations of the Federation and to rebuild its net asset reserves.

### 11 Interfund transfer

In October 2012, the Board of Directors approved the establishment of internally restricted reserves, which are to be equal to three months of insurance expenses and various other operating expenses as estimated at the end of each fiscal year. As at June 30, 2013, the combined internally restricted reserves amounted to \$635,751 (2012 - \$88,308), which reflect a cumulative transfer of \$190,781 from the special assessment fee and interfund transfers of \$444,970 from regular operations.

### 12 Government remittances

Government remittances consist of harmonized sales taxes required to be paid to government authorities, which are recognized when the amounts come due. In respect of government remittances, \$nil (2012 - \$34,644) is included in accounts payable and accrued liabilities.
