

EXAMPLE: how to prepare papers for AGG competitions

The following charts explain how to print judges' working papers and chits for AGG competition. The example presented below assumes there are total 16 judges (4 TV, 4AV and 4EXE judges) and a total of 8 groups competing:

- 2 Child teams (9-10 yo)
- 2 Pre-Novice teams
- 1 Novice team
- 1 Junior team
- 2 Senior teams
