The Gymnastics Ontario Strategic Plan sets out the strategic priorities that will guide direction over the current six years. Through the process of developing the Strategic Plan, four priority directions and 17 strategic objectives were identified and are outlined below. A more detailed description is available in the 2018-2024 Strategic Plan Report. The Strategic Plan does not focus on the many ongoing activities underway at Gymnastics Ontario (GO) and this does not diminish the importance of these activities, as they all contribute to achieving Gymnastics Ontario objectives.

1. Increasing Participation: We will enhance our communication and engagement with our members and our stakeholders to support the retention and growth of gymnastics across Ontario

- A) Develop a targeted approach for non-competitive and non-GO member clubs
- B) Develop a provincial marketing campaign to increase the visibility of gymnastics to Ontarians
- C) Develop a benefit of membership package to strengthen relationship with GO clubs
- D) Develop a communications plan to ensure all key stakeholders have access to timely and accurate information

2. Enhancing Development: We will strengthen the organizational capacity of clubs so they can better offer a quality experience and programs for athletes, coaches and officials

- A) Design and deliver an efficient online coaching education program
- B) Explore feasibility of GO hosting events to ensure highest standards of quality are maintained
- C) Encourage clubs to adhere to the True Sport Principles
- D) Review, update, and communicate GO programs, club guidelines, sanction protocols, insurance coverage and rules to ensure enhanced and safe clubs and competitions

3. **Generating Excellence:** We will define a provincial pathway for athletes, coaches and judges to achieve high performance success.
- A) Provide funding support for training and competitive opportunities for athletes across all disciplines
 - B) Maintain professional development opportunities for technical leaders
 - C) Develop a high-performance pathway for athletes, coaches and judges
 - D) Provide incentives to retiring athletes to become coaches and judges
4. **Sustaining Organizational Effectiveness:** We will have the capacity necessary to lead the organization with an efficient and effective governance and organizational structure
- A) Develop succession plans for key volunteers, board, staff, coaches and officials
 - B) Integrate Risk Management and Management by Values into GO business to foster a high performing culture
 - C) Review the organization's policies and organizational structure, and implement recommended enhancements
 - D) Update GO technologies so they are effectively meeting the needs of GO and its clubs
 - E) Review financial management systems, policies and procedures to ensure we are operating as effectively and efficiently as possible.



President's Message

The past 19 months have been incredibly stressful for all of our member clubs. After being closed during March to May 2020, we were able to open in June 2020 with restrictions. Many clubs ran small programs to start up gradually. During that time, many clubs were not receiving any rent assistance because the program was aimed at landlords.

By mid-October 2020, the regional colour coded rules were introduced and for the next nine months, clubs were moved in and out of various degrees of restrictions. For most of the GTA, clubs were in total shut down from late November 2020 until the middle of July 2021.

So, for our 2020/2021 season, we had perhaps four months of reasonable operations, but still with imposed restrictions.

Certainly, for all of us, the continued confusion in how to interpret the various rules added an extra layer of stress that we did not need. Hours, days and weeks were spent by Gymnastics Ontario trying to get clarification and to influence change in some of the restrictions.

During the partial and full closures, many of our clubs kept their programs alive by offering on-line training for their athletes. For coaches, Gymnastics Ontario created the Supporting Coaches Webinars. There was a total of 32 webinars offered ranging from Mental Health Self Care, Nutrition, Strength Training to technical sessions.

Athletes, parents, and clubs were also invited to attend a series of live events where high-performance athletes from four of the gymnastics disciplines were interviewed and broadcast live on facebook. Interview questions ranged from "how are you dealing with down time during the pandemic and how are you keeping in shape" to "what is your best memory during competitions". The athlete interviews were fun and interactive yet informative.

As our 2020/2021 season came to an end in late June, we still were uncertain about when clubs in some regions might be able to re-open. Fortunately, by mid July 2021, all clubs were allowed to re-open, but at 50% capacity.

Now that our capacity restrictions have been lifted our clubs can begin to re-build and get excited again about the sport we love so much.

Again, I would like to stress that it is the strength of our community which has helped us all endure, and we will continue to keep our sport active, strong, and safe.

I would like to thank the staff, technical committees, volunteers, clubs and Board of Directors for their continued support as we work through these challenging times.

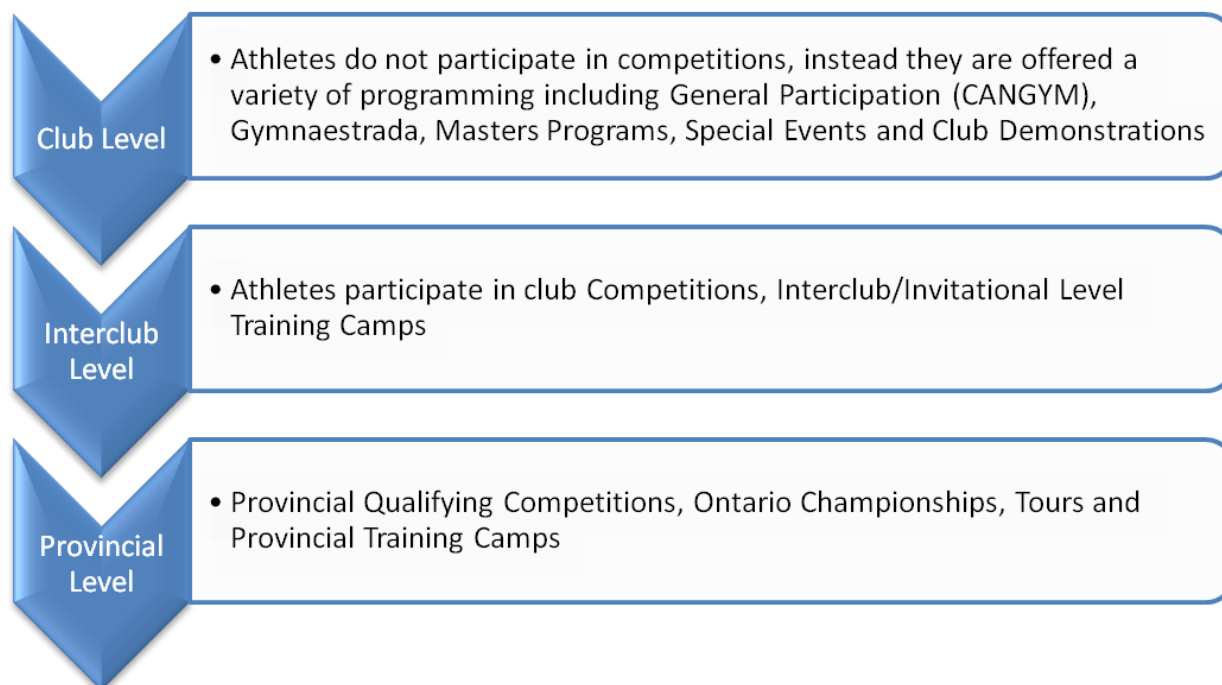

Gymnaestrada

A Gymnaestrada is a participation-based, non-competitive, group routine (with or without props and/or apparatus), gymnastics festival! A Gymnastics for All performance event that allows groups of all ages, gender, skill level, and discipline to showcase their talents, creativity, and love of gymnastics!

This year, due to the ongoing restrictions surrounding COVID-19, *Ontario Gymnaestrada 2021* was restructured as a completely virtual event. This alternative event structure allowed clubs an opportunity to continue engaging their membership while at home. Gymnastics Ontario participated in “*Celebrating Gymnastics – From Here, We Soar*”, a Canada-wide social media activity presented by the GymCan Gymnastics for All Council, from February 6-14, 2021. The objectives of this initiative were to unify the community, show support for the clubs and individual members during this time of uncertainty, and share the love of gymnastics across Canada.

This social media activity helped to bridge the gap as Canadian Gymnastics Week, previously held annually in February, moves to new annual dates in October. This year, Canadian Gymnastics Week will be held as a social media activity from October 3-9, 2021. Ontario Gymnastics Week will match these dates with our week-long “I Love Gymnastics” celebration.

Gymnastics Ontario and the Gymnastics for All Committee look forward to continuing the development of Ontario Gymnastics Week and engaging our member clubs with this celebration of gymnastics.

As of February 2017, the CanGym program has been undergoing a complete program revitalization.

The revitalized CanGym Philosophy:

“CanGym is a nationally recognized collection of Gymnastics for All programs that unites participants, coaches, clubs, and communities. Utilizing an inclusive and developmentally appropriate approach, CanGym empowers participants to build a foundation of physical competence and confidence to enjoy a lifetime of healthy, active living.”

During the 2019-2020 season, the CanGym revitalization project was unfortunately put on hold. The project was resumed in the 2020-2021 season with an updated technical team, and there have been several video updates from GymCan to explain the new program and prepare for the expected launch.

Coach Development

Gymnastics Ontario scheduled 147 NCCP coaching courses in the 2020-2021 season. As a result of Government restrictions causing facility closures across Ontario, a total of 63 in-person NCCP courses cancelled this season.

There were 25 GO Member Clubs located across Ontario that have hosted (or were scheduled to host) NCCP courses. Gymnastics Ontario would like to sincerely thank all host clubs that provided use of their facility and equipment to help make the courses that were able to run a success.

Gymnastics Ontario would like to thank all the hard-working Ontario Learning Facilitators for their time, dedication and flexibility in preparing and adapting courses that have been able to run across the province.

The NCCP is still in a transitional period as we continue to move away from the old NCCP Levels system of training to Community Sport and Competition Stream courses.

The Transfer of Qualifications in the Locker took place for all Artistic coaches on June 1, 2021. The Make Ethical Decisions (MED) Online Evaluation is a requirement for all coaches and Coach Developers looking to become certified in any context within the updated NCCP. Coaches with transferred qualifications will have 5 years from January 1, 2022 to complete the MED Online Evaluation. This is a requirement to maintain an active Certified status. The evaluation must only be completed one time and does not have to be renewed every maintenance cycle.

Gymnastics Ontario, in partnership with Gymnastics Canada, ran an NCCP Information session via the Supporting Coaches Webinar Series to help coaches with questions pertaining to the Transfer of Qualifications and general NCCP inquiries.

Artistic Gymnastics is the first of the gymnastics disciplines to make a full transition into the updated NCCP system of training (Foundations and Competition 1-4). The Transfer of Qualifications has been applied in the Locker for all Women's and Men's Artistic coaching qualifications.

Rhythmic Gymnastics has received final approval for Competition 1 and has upcoming plans to pilot the Competition 2 & Competition 3 courses.

The first Competition 1 Trampoline Technical course in Ontario has been scheduled to run in the 2021-2022 season.

Coach Development (Cont'd)

Acro Competition 1 and the remaining Trampoline course content is currently in the development stages. Competition 2 Trampoline will be piloted in Ontario next season (October 2021).

Remote NCCP learning opportunities for the NCCP Theory modules have been developed and implemented in Ontario. The Foundations Theory and Competition Introduction Theory modules have undergone revisions and transitioned to online delivery as of July 2020. Gymnastics Ontario ran 34 Foundations Theory courses and 7 Competition Introduction Theory courses in the 2020-2021 season.

There were 811 coaches that attended NCCP courses offered in Ontario this past season. This number has dropped dramatically from previous seasons due to the number of course cancellations.

Ontario had 167 coaches complete the Respect in Sport online course this season.

The annual Gymnastics Ontario Coaching Congress (2020) was held remotely as a Webinar opportunity. There were just over 240 coaches registered over three days. Coaches were able to expand their coaching knowledge from the comfort of their own home and the option to choose from 58 available sessions offered by various expert clinicians in their discipline.

To support and keep coaches engaged the ever-popular Supporting Coaches Webinar Series was created and made available to all coaches

Independent auditor's report

To the Members of Ontario Gymnastics Federation

Our opinion

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Ontario Gymnastics Federation (the Federation) as at June 30, 2021 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

What we have audited

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Federation's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Federation or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Federation's financial reporting process.

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

1 Nature of operations

The Ontario Gymnastic Federation (the Federation) was incorporated as a not-for-profit organization without share capital under the Corporations Act of Ontario by letters patent dated April 3, 1974.

The Federation leads the sport of gymnastics in Ontario by striving for excellence in the development and promotion of quality programs and services that encourage lifelong involvement for all participants.

The Federation is a not-for-profit organization as defined under the Income Tax Act (Canada), and therefore no income taxes are provided for in these financial statements.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO). The significant accounting policies are as follows.

Revenue recognition

The Federation follows the deferral method of revenue recognition.

Membership fees, national coaching certification program (NCCP) fees, club fees, user fees, resource sales, other income and marketing and promotion income are recorded as income in the year to which they relate. Amounts received in advance of the related membership year are deferred as at year-end.

Registration and cost sharing fees collected by the Federation on behalf of and remitted to the events' organizers are presented on a net basis in the statement of operations and expenses.

Sponsor grants related to specific events are deferred until the year in which the event is held, at which time they are recorded as income as the amounts are expended on applicable programs. Other grants are included in income when received or receivable.

The Federation also receives grants from the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport. The approved grant for the funding period from April 2019 to March 2020 is \$447,235 (2020 – \$204,579).

Amounts received and receivable under the Temporary Wage Subsidy for Employers (TWSE) and Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) programs are restricted contributions and are recognized in income in the same period when the respective employee expenses are recorded.

Contributed materials and services

A substantial number of volunteers contribute a significant amount of time each year. Due to the difficulty of determining their fair value, these contributed services are not recognized or disclosed in the financial statements. Contributed materials are recorded when received at their fair value unless fair value cannot be reasonably determined.

Cash

Cash consists of cash on hand and bank balances.

Short-term investments

Short-term investments consist of guaranteed investment certificates that are fully redeemable at any time before maturity.

Inventory

Inventory is stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is determined on a first-in, first-out basis. Net realizable value is the selling cost of the product less provision for normal selling costs.

Property and equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization, net of any impairment loss. Amortization is provided at the following annual rates, which will substantially amortize the cost of the assets over their useful lives as follows:

Computer equipment	straight-line over five years
Office equipment	straight-line over five years
Leasehold improvements	straight-line over lease term
Discipline equipment	straight-line over three years

Impairment of long-lived assets

An impairment charge is recognized for long-lived assets whenever an event or change in circumstances causes an asset's carrying value to exceed the total undiscounted cash flows expected from its use and eventual disposition. The impairment loss is calculated as the difference between the fair value of the asset and its carrying value.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with ASNPO requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of income and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ significantly from those estimates.

The outbreak of the novel strain of coronavirus, specifically identified as COVID-19, has resulted in governments worldwide enacting emergency measures to combat the spread of the virus. These measures, which include the implementation of travel bans, self-imposed quarantine periods and social distancing, have caused material disruption resulting in an economic slowdown. Global equity markets have experienced significant volatility and weakness. Governments and central banks have reacted with significant monetary and fiscal interventions designed to stabilize economic conditions.

Financial instruments

The Federation's financial instruments consist of cash, short-term investments, accounts receivable and accounts payable and accrued liabilities and long-term debt. These financial instruments are initially recorded at fair value, except for related party transactions, which are recorded at exchange amount. Subsequently, financial instruments are recorded at cost or amortized cost.

Financial assets are tested for impairment at the end of each reporting period when there are indications the assets may be impaired.

3 Short-term investments

Short-term investments consist of guaranteed investment certificates with a fixed interest rate of 2.35% and a maturity date of July 27, 2021.

12 Interfund transfers

In October 2012, the Board of Directors approved the establishment of internally restricted reserves, which are to be equal to three months of insurance expenses (insurance reserve) and various other operating expenses (operating reserve) as estimated at the end of each fiscal year.

As at June 30, 2021, the combined internally restricted reserves amounted to \$608,000 (2020 – \$901,000), which reflect a cumulative transfer of \$298,414 (2020 – \$298,414) from the special assessment fee and net cumulative interfund transfers of \$309,586 (2020 – \$602,586) from regular operations.

13 Government remittances

Government remittances consist of harmonized sales taxes required to be paid to government authorities, which are recognized when the amounts come due. In respect of government remittances, \$(8,227) (2020 – \$(14,641)) is included in accounts receivable.

14 Risk management of financial instruments

The significant risks the Federation's financial instruments are exposed to are credit risk and liquidity risk.

Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk one party to a financial instrument will fail to discharge an obligation and cause the other party to incur a financial loss. Management of the Federation feels it is not exposed to any significant credit risk.
