The Gymnastics Ontario Strategic Plan sets out the strategic priorities that will guide direction over the current six years. Through the process of developing the Strategic Plan, four priority directions and 17 strategic objectives were identified and are outlined below. A more detailed description is available in the 2018-2024 Strategic Plan Report. The Strategic Plan does not focus on the many ongoing activities underway at Gymnastics Ontario (GO) and this does not diminish the importance of these activities, as they all contribute to achieving Gymnastics Ontario objectives.

- 1. Increasing Participation: We will enhance our communication and engagement with our members and our stakeholders to support the retention and growth of gymnastics across Ontario
 - A) Develop a targeted approach for non-competitive and non-GO member clubs
 - B) Develop a provincial marketing campaign to increase the visibility of gymnastics to Ontarians
 - C) Develop a benefit of membership package to strengthen relationship with GO clubs
 - D) Develop a communications plan to ensure all key stakeholders have access to timely and accurate information
 - 2. Enhancing Development: We will strengthen the organizational capacity of clubs so they can better offer a quality experience and programs for athletes, coaches and officials
 - A) Design and deliver an efficient online coaching education program
 - B) Explore feasibility of GO hosting events to ensure highest standards of quality are maintained
 - C) Encourage clubs to adhere to the True Sport Principles
 - D) Review, update, and communicate GO programs, club guidelines, sanction protocols, insurance coverage and rules to ensure enhanced and safe clubs and competitions



- 3. Generating Excellence: We will define a provincial pathway for athletes, coaches and judges to achieve high performance success.
 - A) Provide funding support for training and competitive opportunities for athletes across all disciplines
 - B) Maintain professional development opportunities for technical leaders
 - C) Develop a high-performance pathway for athletes, coaches and judges
 - D) Provide incentives to retiring athletes to become coaches and judges
- 4. Sustaining Organizational Effectiveness: We will have the capacity necessary to lead the organization with an efficient and effective governance and organizational structure
 - A) Develop succession plans for key volunteers, board, staff, coaches and officials
 - B) Integrate Risk Management and Management by Values into GO business to foster a high performing culture
 - C) Review the organization's policies and organizational structure, and implement recommended enhancements
 - D) Update GO technologies so they are effectively meeting the needs of GO and its clubs
 - E) Review financial management systems, policies and procedures to ensure we are operating as effectively and efficiently as possible.





President's Message

2022-2023. Our first full season completed after two years of closures. Our community has been fortunate in seeing a steady increase in our numbers of recreational athletes, and clubs are working hard to grow their competitive teams.

Our negotiations with Gallagher Insurance were successful in maintaining the current rate of insurance and they also provided our Federation and its member clubs with a new property insurance program.

We also hosted our first in-person Coaching Congress since 2019 with 134 participants. Our young coaches and administrators were excited to be back to in person networking and learning from the experts.

Gymnastics Ontario's Safe Sport Committee continued its important work throughout the season. Among the many objectives and recommendations set out by the committee, we were proud to see the development and completion of the Safe Sport resources on the Gymnastics Ontario website. We also declared the 2023 Artistic Ontario Championships as a True Sport Event, displaying True Sport banners and hosting a representative from the True Sport Foundation. Many other initiatives are in the works and will be rolled out during the next several months.

I would like to acknowledge and thank our membership for the support you have provided to the Federation over the years and specifically providing approval for the most recent increase in our recreation club fee last October.

As always, I would like to thank the staff, technical committees, volunteers, coaches, administrators, clubs and Board of Directors for their continued support as we work towards continuing to grow our great sport.

Gym for All Program Assembly

The second annual Gymnastics for All Program Assembly was held virtually on June 15, 2023, and was well attended. The Assembly provided member clubs the opportunity to learn more about the Gymnastics for All Program, including general information on the Gymnastics for All discipline, current GFA Committee initiatives, future GFA Committee plans, and open sessions (Round Table, Open Forum) to ask questions and connect the community. Following the Assembly, the minutes and presentation slides were distributed to all clubs for further information and future reference.

The GFA Program Committee looks forward to June 2024 and discussing the continued development of Gymnastics for All programming with our member clubs.

GFA Recreational Coach Development Clinics

A new initiative for the 2022-2023 season, GFA Recreational Coach Development Clinics provide ongoing coach development opportunities to our GFA (recreational) coaches and are suitable for recreational coaches (and CITs) of all disciplines! These clinics are offered in different regions of Ontario so that they are accessible to our large recreational coaching community.

Partnering with Rec Gym Pros as our Head Clinician, two GFA Recreational Coach Development Clinics were introduced in this first season:

- January 7, 2023, Newmarket, ON hosted by Pulsars Gymnastics Club 56 participants from 8 clubs.
- June 24, 2023, Nepean, ON hosted by Corona School of Gymnastics 22 participants from 6 clubs.

The clinics were very well received by the clubs attending and the GFA Program Committee is excited to offer between 3-5 clinics in the 2023-2024 season.

A Gymnaestrada is a participation-based, non-competitive, group routine (with or without props and/or apparatus), gymnastics festival! A Gymnastics for All performance event that allows groups of all ages, genders, skill levels, and disciplines to showcase their talents, creativity, and love of gymnastics!

Ontario Gymnaestrada 2023 was held in Oshawa, June 3-4, 2023. The event was a successful return to an in-person format which included Workshops, Performances, and an optional Athlete Party. Although participation was smaller than in previous years, we expect that participation will increase again in 2024 and beyond.

Ontario Gymnastics Week & Canadian Gymnastics Week

Within the 2022-2023 season, Gymnastics Ontario member clubs had the opportunity to participate in two week-long celebrations of gymnastics. *Canadian Gymnastics Week 2022* was held October 2-8, 2022, and *Ontario Gymnastics Week 2023* was held February 11-17, 2023. Both celebrations provided our member clubs with opportunities to celebrate gymnastics across the Province and within their own clubs and communities.

Canadian Gymnastics Week 2022 (CGW 2022) was a virtual event run by Gymnastics Canada. Each day highlighted one of the True Sport Principles. Gymnastics Ontario supported this event by sharing the GymCan social media posts and encouraging our member clubs to participate.

Ontario Gymnastics Week 2023 (OGW 2023), also known as Ontario "I Love Gymnastics" Week, is an annual event celebrated in February. This year's Information Package for Member Clubs provided details on the many ways our member clubs could participate. Many activities were favourites from previous years, with updates to remain current and interesting. The package also included some new additions; a social media contest with some amazing prizes and a new activity: "Why I Love Gymnastics" Athlete Interviews.

Gymnastics Ontario executed a comprehensive communication plan for OGW 2023. The plan included email communication detailing the daily activities available, and social media posts providing useful information and shareable material relevant to our member clubs.

CanGym Program

As of February 2017, the CanGym program has been undergoing a complete program revitalization.

The revitalized CanGym Philosophy:

"CanGym is a nationally recognized collection of Gymnastics for All programs that unites participants, coaches, clubs, and communities. Utilizing an inclusive and developmentally appropriate approach, CanGym empowers participants to build a foundation of physical competence and confidence to enjoy a lifetime of healthy, active living."

During the 2022-2023 season, the CanGym revitalization project has continued development. The new CanGym Program was launched in Fall 2022 online as a free pilot version for the Active Start (ages 0-6) component only. The CanGym Program will be transitioned to a paid subscription in Fall 2023 and future components will be released over time.

Coach Development

Gymnastics Ontario scheduled a total of 224 NCCP coaching courses in the 2022-2023 season.

There were 58 GO Member Clubs located across Ontario that have hosted NCCP courses this season. Gymnastics Ontario would like to sincerely thank all host clubs that provided use of their facilities and equipment to help make the courses a success. Gymnastics Ontario has reinvested approximately \$37,000 back into host clubs through facility rental fees and complimentary participant registration reimbursements.

Gymnastics Ontario would also like to acknowledge all the hard-working Ontario Learning Facilitators for their time, dedication, and flexibility in preparing (and adapting) courses that have been able to run across the province.

The NCCP is still in a transitional period as we continue to move away from the old NCCP Levels system of training to Community Sport and Competition Stream courses for the remaining disciplines (Trampoline and Rhythmic). The Transfer of Qualifications for both disciplines is tentatively scheduled for early 2024. The transfer date largely relies on the completion of the Competition Stream courses.

The Make Ethical Decisions (MED) Online Evaluation is a requirement for all coaches and Coach Developers looking to become certified in any context within the updated NCCP system of training. Coaches with transferred qualifications will have 5 years from January 1, 2022, to complete the MED Online Evaluation. This is a requirement to maintain an active Certified status in every discipline and context. The evaluation must only be completed one time and does not have to be renewed every maintenance cycle. Gymnastics Ontario ran three MED online courses over Ontario Gymnastics Week in February 2023 at a discounted rate of \$5.00 per coach.

Artistic Gymnastics is the first of the gymnastics disciplines to make a full transition into the updated NCCP system of training (Foundations and Competition 1-4). The Transfer of Qualifications has been applied in the Locker for all Women's and Men's Artistic coaching qualifications as of 2021. Gymnastics Ontario and Gymnastics Canada continue to work together to manually update any outstanding coaching credentials that have not been transferred to the correct equivalent status in the Locker.

Competition 3 Trampoline is estimated to be offered in December 2023 (Toronto area).

Rhythmic Gymnastics ran the Competition 2 pilot July 2022, with a second revised pilot scheduled for next season. Plans for the Competition 3 pilot are still underway.

Final revisions of the Competition 1 Acro course were submitted in June 2023. The course should be available to run in the upcoming months.



Coach Development (Cont'd)

The Competition 3 WAG/MAG course and LF Training ran in July 2022, with a second set of courses offered in June 2023.

Acro Competition 1 and the remaining Rhythmic/Trampoline course content is currently in the development stages.

NCCP Theory modules for Foundations and Competition Introduction have officially transitioned to online delivery. All Theory modules moving forward can be accessed through Gymnastics Ontario online learning and Coaches Association of Ontario online learning.

There were 3828 coaches that registered for NCCP courses offered in Ontario this season.

Ontario had 581 coaches complete the Respect in Sport online course (567 initial certifications and 14 recertifications).

The annual GO Coaching Congress (2022) took place in August at Milton Springers Gymnastics. A total of 124 coaches attended Coaching Congress in-person, held over two days.

Gymnastics Ontario, in partnership with Gymnastics Canada, offered a recording of the NCCP Information session via the Supporting Coaches Webinar Series to help coaches with questions pertaining to the Transfer of Qualifications and general NCCP inquiries. Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Ontario Gymnastic Federation which comprise the statement of financial position as at June 30, 2023 and the statement of operations, statement of changes in net assets and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

NATURE OF OPERATIONS

The Ontario Gymnastic Federation (the "Organization) was incorporated as a not-for-profit organization without share capital under the Corporations Act of Ontario by letters patent dated April 3, 1974.

The Organization leads the sport of gymnastics in Ontario by striving for excellence in the development and promotion of quality programs and services that encourage lifelong involvement for all participants.

The Organization is a not-for-profit organization as defined under the Income Tax Act (Canada), and therefore no income taxes are provided for these financial statements.

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations ("ASNPO").

The financial statements include the following significant accounting policies:

a) Use of Estimates

The preparation of the consolidated financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions based on currently available information. Such estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the year. Actual results could differ from the estimates used. Significant estimates include any allowance for inventory obsolescence, and estimated useful lives of property and equipment.

b) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash held in bank accounts.

c) Capital assets

Capital assets are recorded at cost. Amortization is being provided over the estimated useful life of the assets using the following annual rates and methods:

d) Impairment of Long-Lived Assets

When a tangible capital asset no longer contributes to an organization's ability to provide goods and services, or the value of future economic benefits or service potential associated with the tangible capital asset is less than its carrying amount, the net carrying amount of the tangible capital asset is written down to the asset's fair value or replacement cost.

e) Revenue Recognition

The Organization follows the deferral method of revenue recognition.

Membership fees, national coaching certification program (NCCP) fees, club fees, user fees, resource sales, other income and marketing and promotion income are recorded as revenue in the year to which they relate. Amounts received in advance of the related membership year are deferred.

Registration and cost sharing fees collected by the Organization on behalf of and remitted to the events' organizers are presented on a net basis in the statement of operations.

Sponsor grants related to specific events are deferred until the year in which the event is held, at which time they are recorded as revenue as the amounts are expended on applicable programs. Other grants are included in revenue when received or receivable.

f) Contributed Materials and Services

Volunteers contribute a significant number of hours per year to assist the Organization in carrying out its activities. Because of the difficulty in determining their fair market value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements. Contributed materials are recorded when received at their fair value unless fair value cannot be reasonably determined.

g) Financial Instruments

Measurement of Financial Instruments

The Organization initially measures its financial assets and liabilities originated or exchanged in arm's length transactions at fair value. Financial assets and liabilities originated or exchanged in related party transactions, except for those that involve parties whose sole relationship with the Organization is in the capacity of management, are initially measured at cost. The cost of a financial instrument in a related party transaction depends on whether the instrument has repayment terms. The Organization subsequently measures all its financial assets and liabilities at cost or amortized cost.



NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES- Continued

g) Measurement of Financial Instruments - Continued

Financial assets subsequently measured at amortized cost include cash, investments and accounts receivable. Financial liabilities subsequently measured at amortized cost include accounts payable, accrued liabilities and the CEBA loan.

The Organization has no financial assets measured at fair value and has not elected to carry any financial asset or liability at fair value.

Impairment

Financial assets measured at cost are tested for impairment when there are indicators of impairment. The amount of the write-down, if any, is recognized in excess of revenue over expenses. The previously recognized impairment loss may be reversed, to the extent of the improvement, directly or by adjusting the allowance account. The reversal may be recorded provided it is no greater than the amount that had been previously reported as a reduction in the asset and it does not exceed original cost. The amount of the reversal is recognized in the excess (deficiency) of revenues over expenses.

2. INVESTMENTS

Investments consist of eight guaranteed investment certificates. One guaranteed investment certificate bears an annual interest at 5.20%, maturing on February 9, 2024. The remaining guaranteed investment certificates bear an annual interest at 2.50%, maturing on April 20, 2024.

3. PREPAID EXPENSES

The significant increase in prepaids is due to the prepayment for the April 2023-March 2024 season, as the insurance policy has changed from July-June to April-March. This was implemented so the Organization could advise clubs of the July 1 increase prior to the new season starting.

7. CEBA LOAN PAYABLE

The Organization received a non-interest bearing \$40,000 Canada Emergency Business Account ("CEBA") loan as part of the Canadian government's support for small businesses and not-for-profit organizations in response to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. In the 2021 fiscal year, the forgivable portion of \$10,000 of the CEBA was recognized as revenue in the statement of operations as there is reasonable assurance that the Organization will repay the remaining balance by the due date. The remaining \$30,000 loan is repayable by January 18, 2024 and is non-interest bearing until that date.

8. GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE

The Organization also receives grants from the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport. The approved grant for the funding period from April 2022 to March 2023 is \$210,592 (2022-\$204,579). Additional grants received relate to coaching and training, as well as Covid-TWSE, for \$7,570 (2022-\$Nil).

10. CONTINGENCY

In the normal course of its operations, the Organization is party to legal matters. The Organization makes provisions when it deems appropriate. In the opinion of management, the total amount of potential liability cannot be reasonably estimated. Any liability, net of amount accrued, will not have any significant unfavourable impact on the Organization's financial position.

11. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

During the year, the Organization entered into various transactions with member clubs, which are owned by a member of the senior management team or various members of the Board of Directors. Revenues earned from these member clubs amounted to \$262,942 (2022 - \$183,444) and expenses incurred amounted to \$4,618 (2022- \$23,012).

As at June 30, 2023 these member clubs had prepaid membership fees relating to the 2023/2024 membership year in the amount of \$14,179 (2022-\$12,625). These transactions were in the normal course of operations. The member clubs are charged fees consistent with arm's length clubs.

12. INTERNALLY RESTRICTED RESERVES AND INTERFUND TRANSFERS

In October 2012, the Board of Directors approved the establishment of internally restricted reserves, which are to be equal to three months of insurance expenses (insurance reserve) and various other operating expenses (operating reserve) as estimated at the end of each fiscal year.

As at June 30, 2023, the combined internally restricted reserves amounted to \$1,166,000 (2022-\$1,028,000) which reflect a cumulative transfer of \$298,414 (2022 - \$298,414) from the special assessment fee and net cumulative interfund transfers of \$867,586 (2022 - \$729,586) from regular operations.

13. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Risks and Concentrations

The Organization is exposed to various risks through its financial instruments. The following analysis provides a summary of the Organization's exposure to and concentrations of risk at June 30, 2023:

a) Credit Risk

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will cause a financial loss for the other party by failing to discharge an obligation. The Organization is exposed to this risk mainly in respect of its accounts receivable. Management mitigates this risk by actively keeping their receivables up to date. There has been no change in the assessment of credit risk from the prior year.

b) Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk relates to the risk that the Organization will encounter difficulty in meeting its obligations associated with financial liabilities. The Organization is exposed to this risk mainly in respect of its accounts payable and accrued liabilities and CEBA loan. Management mitigates this risk by closely monitoring cash flow needs. There has been no change in the assessment of liquidity risk from the prior year.

c) Market Risk

Market risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. Market risk comprises three types of risk: currency risk, interest rate risk, and price risk. The Organization is not exposed to significant market risk.
